EQUIPMENT GUIDELINES FOR 2024 EVENT

ALL Golf Equipment MUST be Produced post-1930, or the "Hickory Shaft" Era, and Prior to 1993.

A.) Woods

Clubheads are to made of Wood, (Laminated or Persimmon), or other species of wood. Composite materials are not acceptable.

Woods clubs' shafts may be made of Steel, Aluminum, Titanium, Fiberglass, or Graphite. (Modern shafts are acceptable as long as the clubhead specs are traditional).

Maximum driver length is 48"

Clubhead's insert materials must be made of either, Paper Fiber, Phenolic, Cycolac, Fiberglass, Aluminum, and/or Wood.

Clubs' Grips must be conforming to USGA, and may be made of Rubber, Corded, or Leather. (Modern golf grips are acceptable)

Fairway wood designs must be designed, and built out of wood., (i.e., #7, #9 woods, etc.)

No hybrids

B.) IRON HEADS, WEDGES

All iron heads must be forgings, produced between post-1930, and pre-1993.

NO CAST irons clubs.

Irons from #1-PW are acceptable

ALL Wedges must be fashioned from traditional wedges, and produced between post-1930 and pre1993.

ALL Sand wedges must also fit the time period.

Shafts in Iron clubs may be made of Steel, Aluminum, Graphite, Fiberglass, or Titanium. (Modern shafts are acceptable)

C.) PUTTERS

ALL Putters must be **forgings**.

NO CAST Putters.

Putter designs must fit the designated time period (Post 1930 - Pre 1993), and must be traditional in nature. Putter length shall not exceed 38". No "broom putters", or "belly-putters"

(Modern shafts and conforming putter grips are acceptable) but not encouraged.

D.) GOLF BALLS – ALL Golf Balls must be conforming in nature, and must be listed on the current USGA Conforming / Approved Golf Ball List. Softer Compression modern golf balls are encouraged.

E). ATTIRE and DRESS

Dress codes must comply with Rules posted by the host club / golf course.

We are not concerned with, nor requiring time-period dress.

However, proper golf attire is required, and must meet the host venues Dress Codes. collared shirt and proper golf attire are encouraged and should be understood.

Non-metal, or soft spike-like golf shoes are required.
